Foil Print Moon

Supplies:

Paper Plates or paint plates
Black Paper (and white paper, if you want children to practice cutting)
Silver or White Paint (or glow in the dark!)
Aluminum foil

Instructions:

Pour paint onto paper plates. Have children make a ball with a piece of aluminum foil and then flatten the bottom of the ball. Dip the ball in the paint and dab a circle of "dabs" onto the black paper to create a full moon. (Or teach phases of the moon!) Let dry; if desired, poke tiny holes in the paper and hang in the window to let the light through the holes like stars.
