1 Round Paint Palette

1 Wolfe Face Art & FX Palette

1 CCBeauty Paint Palette

2 Powder Brushes (Powder not included)

2 Pouches of assorted brushes & applicators (consumable, may need replaced)

All items must be returned clean and in their proper containers.

Use soapy water to clean all applicators.

Leave no paint residue on container or kit components.

We expect some applicators to reach the end of use and be disposed of.

Please alert staff if applicators need to be replenished. We suggest that if you are doing a large crowd, you consider purchasing some of your own disposable applicators, especially makeup sponges for the sake of cleanliness.

KEEP IT CLEAN!!

Make sure you don't let water pool in the face paint. Paint is often diluted with water for all-over coverage. You may want to spray your sponges directly with water instead of spraying the face paint to keep them drier. Keep the lids on paints when you're not using them and don't let anyone touch them.

Keep baby wipes at hand so you can clean your hands when they get dirty or in between customers.

If the person getting painted has a dirty face or the area you are going to paint over is dirty, then offer a baby wipe so they can clean themselves.

Clean your applicators with soapy water between each person, rinse and rub/wipe with an antibacterial wipe. Alternatively, use a pump bottle of hand sanitizer to create a pool of cleaner that you can leave your brush/applicator sitting in until wiping it clean for reuse. This method is less likely to spill and remains an active bacterial killer rather than drying out. If the applicator is going to sit in it for a while, you might consider putting your sanitizer in the lower portion of a zip bag and sealing it once brush tips are embedded in the sanitizer.

Change your brush water frequently. Keep one container of soapy water and one of rinse water. It's a good idea to bring both waters in squeeze bottles so that you can dump and replenish with little mess.

Another good idea: keep separate locations for unused and used applicators. If you're going the one-person one-use route (switching to new applicators for each person) make sure you have a landing place (like a grocery bag) for used applicators until they can be properly cleaned.

Thoroughly clean, sanitize, and dry applicators when the event is over.

Microwave sponges for 2 minutes after washing with soap and water to kill bacteria.

Let all sponges & applicators dry completely before placing them back in the kit.
