The Chariton Free Public Library Board held its regular monthly meeting in the Library Meeting Room on June 9, 2022, pursuant to notice given under the Iowa Open Meetings law. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

Present were Trustees Fenton, Meyer, Miller, Pillsbury-Allen and Watkins-Schoenig. Also present were City Manager Liegois, Librarian Murphy, City Councilman McGee and LCGS members Patterson and Terrell.

The Agenda was unanimously adopted on a motion from Meyer, seconded by Miller.

Public Forum: none

Good News: Murphy offered the first program at the Chariton Farmers Market today. She reported that it went very well and we have high hopes for the upcoming weekly Farmers Market programs scheduled through July.

The Consent Agenda (below) was unanimously approved on a motion from Meyer, seconded by Pillsbury-Allen.

Our \$5,000 ARPA Grant check arrived from the State as reimbursement for the purchase Outdoor Charging Stations. Murphy will apply for the Vredenburg Foundation Grant to be used towards ongoing construction project costs.

The June 2022 Claims were unanimously approved on a motion from Meyer, seconded by Watkins-Schoenig.

Unfinished Business

Lucas County Genealogical Society members Karen Patterson and Sue Terrell reported on their interactions with researchers during the month of May. They also reminded the Library Board that they'll be at the Chariton Cemetary on June 13th to demonstrate the art of grave witching. Anyone from the public wishing to attend may try it out for themselves.

Meyer moved to cash the **Blake Trust funds** when the investment matures on 7/10/22. Miller seconded and the motion passed

Watkins-Schoenig moved to accept the quote (\$3,789) from Mainstay Systems of Iowa for the FY23 purchase and installation of a **new Library network server**. Meyer seconded. Miller questioned where the funding would come from. Our new equipment budget for FY23 is only \$1,000. The Board and City will amend the FY23 budget in March or April of 2023 to accommodate th

New Business

Meyer moved to approve the new *Agreement Between The Chariton Public Library and The Lucas County Genealogical Society* as presented. Watkins-Schoenig seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Consideration of the Elevator Maintenance Options presented by OTIS, KONE and Schumacher were tabled to allow the Building Committee to review them thoroughly and bring a recommendation to the Board.

Investment Options: On a motion from Meyer, seconded by Miller, the Board directs the City Clerk to issue an RFP to local financial institutions and to People's Bank for money market account investment options for Library funds. The Board will use the information provided by the City Clerk at the July 14th meeting.

Meyer's photographs show that waterproofing was not extended along the west and east sides of the stairs, which is what the Library Board intended should be done. The plan below seemed to show, and Soenke had told the Board, that the waterproofing would extend along the base of the stairs.

During the meeting Soenke contacted Fairholm & the issue of the waterproofing not wrapping the front pillars was discussed. Fairholm said that the area to the west of the stairs, filled only that morning, could be dug out again (possibly with a change order) to install waterproofing around the pillars/corners adjacent to the stairs, and that on the east side, still unfilled, waterproofing would be installed.

CHARITON FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S REPORT THURSDAY JULY 14, 2022

The summer program is progressing. Our numbers are not great.

The Thursday programs at the Farmers Market are a big hit. At the "Follow That Monkey" program we gave away little monkeys that I fired from a slingshot. Each kid then took a turn at the slingshot. We moved like animals & made the appropriate noises. It was great! I missed one week of programs this month due to illness. I'll make up the Farmers Market program by tacking it on the end of that schedule.

I have submitted the **FY22 Open Access** (borrowers outside of our county) to the State. This determines some of the funding we receive from the State, as we are reimbursed for serving these patrons from outside our legal service area. We had 1,126 circulations to 39 OA borrowers, mostly from Corydon, Humeston & Melrose, although one couple from Indianola who visit our area regularly checked out 229 items, all DVDs. We received \$531.07.

I also submitted our **FY22 Direct State Aid Report**, which details how we spent the State/Federal funding that is divided amongst Iowa libraries without being tied to specific services or numbers. We received \$2,078.83.

\$157.78 Technology & Equipment – Microphone for Meeting Room to facilitate online meetings. Wireless receiver for meeting room public computer. Laptop Stands for Staff circulation desk laptops received through a grant secured by City of Chariton. Vacuum replacement parts.

\$315.15 Building Improvements – We had to replace the entire canopy over our north entrance. The work was performed by one of the City crew working with the local trades class from the high school. Additional work was done in the ladies room. This funding covered materials for these repairs.

\$1,605.90 Other Purchases - Report the amount spent on other items or services used to improve library services.

\$316.26 was spent on our annual movie licensing. \$540.65 was spent on dehumidifiers, a fan and cleaning agents to be used to combat the moisture in our basement prior to having a major waterproofing project done. \$109.00 was spent on flag-mounted signs. \$639.99 was spent to purchase a collapsible ladder making it easier and safer for city staff to reach light fixtures and attic entrances.

Total Amount Spent -- must equal the amount of Direct State Aid received. \$2,078.83

Impact of Funding – We are in the midst of major building repair and refurbishment. A portion of these funds kept our basement usable when moisture became an issue. Another part of our big building project is total replacement of the canopy over the north building entrance. As we upgraded our network, some areas of the building went Wi-Fi only, including the meeting room & DSA funds allowed us to adapt and improve hardware used in that room to meet the change. Most of these issues are things we're working to remedy permanently, but the projects are part of a long list we're working through strategically, and these were on hold until other repairs could be made, so this funding allowed us to stay operational as we work our way through this multi-year refurbishment project.

I've contacted PRIMO again due to the fact that the NW upstairs thermostat is blank again.

Chariton Free Public Library July 14, 2022

The Chariton Free Public Library Board held its regular monthly meeting in the Library Meeting Room on July 14, 2022, pursuant to notice given under the Iowa Open Meetings law. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

Present were Trustees Bisgard, Fenton, Meyer, Miller, Seuferer and Watkins-Schoenig (online). Also present were Director Murphy and LCGS members Terrell and Patterson.

The Agenda was unanimously adopted on a motion from Meyer, seconded by Bisgard.

Public Forum: Terrell and Patterson reported they had 16 people attend their witching demonstration. Their next meeting is August 8, 2022, during which a speaker will offer a program on LIDAR, the radar used to locate previous construction and other items to be found on historical homesteads.

Good News: We had 23 at the Farmer's Market program today.

Miller moved to approve the **Consent Agenda**, including the **June 9, 2022 Meeting and June 17, 2022 Special Meeting Minutes, Correspondence** Donation in Memory of Ruth Morgan, Given by Doris McNeilly -- \$80, **June 2022 Financial Statement, May 2022 Treasurer's Report & April 2022 corrected Treasurer's Report**, and **Grants** Vredenburg Foundation 2022 Grant Report & 2023 Grant Request for construction projects submitted, REAP Grant from State Historical Society was not awarded for Windows Project . Seuferer seconded the motion and the Consent Agenda was approved unanimously.

The July, 14 2022 Claims were unanimously approved on a motion from Bisgard, seconded Seuferer.

Unfinished Business

Library Investment Options: The City Clerk provided two responses to her RFP sent to local banks, one from People's Bank and the other from Midwest Heritage. (Attached) Meyer also contacted Community First Credit Union to get their rates. There was question as to whether the local branch of each bank had been the recipient of the prior RFP or if it went to corporate offices elsewhere.

Meyer motioned to reject these responses to the original RFP and request the City Clerk send out a new RFP requesting just the Money Market Rates from all local banks and Peoples Bank. Miller seconded. Bisgard, Fenton, Meyer, Miller, Seuferer and Watkins-Schoenig all voted aye and the motion carried unanimously.

New Business

Library Personnel Policy & City of Chariton Employee Handbook

Murphy submitted a Library Personnel Policy to supplement the City's Employee Handbook addressing specific differences unique to the library department, (Attached, Library additions in **red**) for review.

Watkins-Schoenig questioned the definitions for employee from the City Handbook, which were attached. There was some discussion trying to determine which category our employees fall into. Murphy has done research to determine what the federal and state laws are, but found nothing to address the discrepancies in the City Handbook. Meyer suggested it was the ACA (Affordable Care Act). Seuferer moved to table the Personnel Policy to August until these questions were answered. Meyer seconded. Bisgard, Fenton, Meyer, Miller, Seuferer and Watkins-Schoenig all voted aye and the motion carried unanimously.

Construction Committee (Meyer reviewed the topics discussed at the 7/12/2022 meeting, minutes attached) Meyer and Murphy reported on a visit from John Beck Electric (7/13/22 @ 1:30pm). Murphy showed Beck several of the electrical issues the Library is currently dealing with and provided Beck with the Lighting drawings prepared by Engineer Lynn Vannoy for replacement of the current upstairs fixtures. Beck also received spec sheets for the existing fixtures, both the suspended lighting and the can lights in the stage area. He will get back to us with options and numbers. We anticipate a visit from Tesdell Electric as well.

Summer programs are over. We are taking our August programming break. But readers have until August 19th to continue reading and may turn in their reading logs on or after that date to receive a medal & small prizes.

The Thursday programs at the Farmers Market were the best part of this summer's programming. We will absolutely do it again next year, and most likely we'll match the entirety of the Market's schedule, rather than only offering them during our summer program dates. Despite the coming and going of market shoppers during the program, there are a few families that work the market who have very attentive children that love to attend, and we have a couple of families who attended every week who were otherwise not involved with the market itself. I noticed parents meeting up each week to chat while their kids were at our program. Add to that the folks who only found us because they were there for the market on that particular day and it was a great situation for us and for them! I'd like to do more outreach programming that matches up with events already being offered here in the community. Chariton Free Public Library August 11, 2022

The Chariton Free Public Library Board held its regular monthly meeting in the Library Meeting Room on August 11, 2022 pursuant to notice given under the Iowa Open Meetings law. The meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM.

Trustees Bisgard, Fenton, Mefferd, Meyer, Pillsbury-Allen, Seuferer and Sharp were present. Librarian Murphy and city council liaison Jarett McGee (virtual) were also present.

The **Agenda** was unanimously adopted as amended on a motion from Seuferer, seconded by Meyer.

Good News Librarian Murphy gave the board an update on the successful summer programs given at the Chariton Farmer's Market.

Public forum: none

The **consent agenda** was unanimously approved on a motion from Meyer seconded by Pillsbury-Allen.

The **August 2022 Claims** were reviewed by the board. The claims included resubmission of a \$3,000 payment to Primo Heating and Cooling that was originally submitted in February, but had not been paid out by the city. After discussion, the **claims** were unanimously approved on a motion from Mefferd, seconded by Miller.

Unfinished Business:

Consideration of Library Funds Investment Options:

The board reviewed bids for deposit of library funds from First Interstate Bank, Midwest Heritage, US Bank, and Peoples Bank. Meyer recommended that the library choose US Bank, due to their bid offering the highest rate of return at 1.25%.

It was moved by Meyer and seconded by Mefferd to open a money market account at US Bank and deposit as much of the current library funds as possible, given consideration of moneys required for monthly operations at the discretion of the city treasurer. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Library Personnel Policy and Chariton City Employee Handbook: After discussion, it was moved by Mefferd and seconded by Seuferer to approve the policy as amended by Mefferd. Motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Library Conflict of Interest Policy: After discussion, it was moved by Mefferd and seconded by Pillsbury-Allen to approve the policy. Motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

New Business:

Doors Inc. Quote: The board discussed the need to replace the south doors as part of the overall library renovations. The construction committee recommended Doors Inc. due to their work as part of the Hotel Charitone renovations. It was moved by Mefferd and seconded by Miller to accept the bid from Doors Inc. for \$9,489, subject to design approval by the Chariton Historical Preservation Commission. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Spectrum Lighting Quote: The board discussed the need to update the lighting on the upstairs level of the library as part of the overall library renovations. The construction committee recommended Spectrum Lighting, due to their work at the Indianola library. Bids were also solicited from two other firms, who did not submit bids by the deadline. It was moved by Mefferd and seconded by Meyer to accept the bid from Spectrum Lighting for \$9,275. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

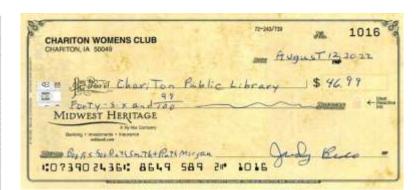

CHARITON FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S REPORT THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 8, 2022

The local book clubs have invited me to speak again at their annual combined meeting on September 26th.

All of August I have been working steadily to get the Bin/Kit lending program items ready to circulate. They now fall into several categories and many of them are ready to go.

Each Kit has its own catalog record. Each book or other collection item has its own catalog record. Several additional materials can be found in many of the Kits as well, some with a catalog record, others without. Each Kit has a circulation sheet which can be printed on demand for circulation. That sheet includes a list of all the items contained in the Kit & is the agreement signed by the borrower. Several, but not all of the Kits have supplemental binders with instructions, ideas and reproducible content. I'm still working on those binders for several Kits.

All of the Red Bins are ready to circulate, although some do not yet have completed binders to accompany them. These are the Book Bins, meaning that their contents deal with a single subject or grouping of subjects and that

they contain mostly books with the addition of assorted activities and supplemental items pertaining to their subject matter.

A collection of Bags consist of the same sort of items, but the number of items doesn't require a Bin. There are still a couple of Bags of this type waiting to be finished, once the themes can be determined to make the best use of the titles we own.

Another set of Bags that are only partly done are MAKER Kits, although as I work my way through out MakerSpace tools and materials many of them will end up in any container I can find that best suits them. We will not circulate any MAKER Kits until the majority of that type are ready to go. So far we have a Jewelry MAKER Kit, Origami Kit, several fiber arts kits, including a sewing machine, Facepainting Kits, etc.

The next main Bin set is made up of all of the STEM kits that Dawn secured for us. We actually call them STEAM kits. I did all the cataloging and organizing of these kits earlier this year, but did go back in August to create their circulation sheets. They are ready to circulate.

So far, the number of Bin/Kit items is over 1,250 individual cataloged items & then there's an unknown number of other items included in them that did not get cataloged separately. The number of individual "kits" cataloged is 65. It's been a massive undertaking and has made the program office an unpleasant place to be on occasion.

But, I've converted the other office into a staffroom and relocated all of the items that used to be stored in the staff closet to that room, including the processing supplies for new collection items, the collection repair supplies, cataloging supplies, operating supplies, and tech supplies, like extra headphones & wiring.

And so, the staff closet has become storage for all of the circulating Bins & Kits. We're still working on the shelving to accommodate the biggest bins, but this way the items have a specific permanent home where they can stay until requested and checked out. Desk Staff no longer need to leave a kit to be checked in by the program person, but can check it out, check it in, and reshelve it just like any other item.

Chariton Free Public Library September 8, 2022

The Chariton Free Public Library Board held its regular monthly meeting in the Library Meeting Room on September 8, 2022 pursuant to notice given under the Iowa Open Meetings law. The meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM.

Trustees Bisgard, Fenton, Mefferd, Meyer, Seuferer and Sharp were present. Librarian Murphy was also present.

The **Agenda** was unanimously adopted as amended on a motion from Mefferd, seconded by Bisgard.

Good News Murphy gave the board an update on construction progress and the conclusion of the summer reading program.

Public forum: none

The **consent agenda** was unanimously approved on a motion from Meyer seconded by Seuferer.

Consideration to approve D&T Services bid:

The board discussed a bid from D&T services for demolition of walls and cabinetry and removal of items from the Laura Curtis room and book sale rooms in the basement of the library. Librarian Murphy recommended that the board approve the quote so that work could begin in the basement as soon as next week, pending payment of the September claims. It was moved by Meffered and seconded by Meyer to approve the bid from D&T Services for demolition and removal of refuse in the amount of \$1,922. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

The **September 2022 Claims** were reviewed by the board. The claims included the aforementioned bid from D&T Services. After discussion, the **claims** were unanimously approved on a motion from Seuferer, seconded by Mefferd.

Unfinished Business:

Doors Inc. Replacement of South (Front) Entrance Door and Surround: Meyer updated the board on the progress of the front door replacement project. The design is working its way through design approval by the Chariton Historical Preservation Commission, who voiced some concerns on the final color of the doors and soffits. Meyer will continue discussions with the CHPC and the board will contact Bruce Smith of Smith Auto Body for options to paint the doors before installation.

PRIMO HVAC Concerns: Librarian Murphy shared with the board that PRIMO technicians visited the library on September 8th and met with herself and board members Bisgard and Meyer to address ongoing concerns about the HVAC system. Three of the four units installed are currently working. One unit has a cracked drip pan, which may be causing the unit to shut down. PRIMO indicated they would continue to work with Murphy and the library board to resolve the issues.

New Business:

Consideration to approve Bovard Studio quote for restoration of stained glass windows: The board discussed a bid from Bovard Studio for restoration of the original stained glass windows on the west and east sides of the original building. The board reviewed material presented by Bovard Studio and discussed the current state of the windows. It was moved by Mefferd and seconded by Bisgard that because the project is of a specialized nature such that there are likely no other credible bidders available, and on the basis of Bovard Studio's reputation as a recommended bidder, to accept the bid for restoration of the stained glass windows for the amount of \$21,483. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Spectrum Lighting Installation and Library Closure: Librarian Murphy shared that Spectrum Lighting is ready to install lighting fixtures on September 29th and 30th. It was Murphy's recommendation that the library close on those two days to allow for the work to be completed. It was moved by Seuferer and seconded by Mefferd to authorize Murphy to close the library on September 29th and 30th for lighting installation. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Dear Friends:

The Chariton Free Public Library is now 118 years old! Built in 1904, the Library is one of the architectural gems of Lucas County. It is an excellent representative of Carnegie libraries and an excellent example of how such a library can be expanded without losing its original character. This is true of both the interior and exterior of the Library. Out-of-town visitors often express their amazement on entering something like a time capsule. For many, it seems, our building epitomizes the character of traditional libraries. The modern contents of the shelves and the technology available cannot diminish that feeling. It's this sense of living history that we strive to maintain, especially as an example to future generations, of the successful marriage between history and the present.

Many building repairs have been undertaken throughout the years. Most recently (2021) we've addressed issues with the roof and replaced several HVAC units. This summer we remedied an age-old leak issue by waterproofing the original foundation and redirecting drainage with new eaves and downspouts. Next on the agenda are the restoration of the main entrance door, replacement of interior lighting on the main floor, and repair of the stained glass windows. After that we hope to replace all of the other windows in the building, not only because repair is needed, but also to return to sash hung windows in keeping with the original design of the Library.

Next spring we hope to complete the landscaping necessitated by the waterproofing work and to repair and paint the eaves and soffits. Later, possibly in 2024, we'll be able to refurbish the basement rooms that were affected by the leaks.

As you can imagine, all of this work comes with a hefty price tag – nearly half a million dollars. We have used endowment funds left to the Library and have received some generous grants from local foundations, but are still in need of monetary help to finish these necessary projects.

Chariton Free Public Library September 8, 2022 Amended October 13, 2022

The Chariton Free Public Library Board held its regular monthly meeting in the Library Meeting Room on September 8, 2022 pursuant to notice given under the Iowa Open Meetings law. The meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM.

Trustees Bisgard, Fenton, Mefferd, Meyer, Seuferer and Sharp were present. Librarian Murphy was also present.

The **Agenda** was unanimously adopted as amended on a motion from Mefferd, seconded by Bisgard.

Good News Librarian Murphy gave the board an update on construction progress and the conclusion of the summer reading program.

Public forum: none

The **consent agenda** was unanimously approved on a motion from Meyer seconded by Seuferer.

Consideration to approve D&T Services bid:

The board discussed a bid from D&T services for demolition of walls and cabinetry and removal of items from the Laura Curtis room and book sale rooms in the basement of the library. Librarian Murphy recommended that the board approve the quote so that work could begin in the basement as soon as next week, pending payment of the September claims. It was moved by Mefferd and seconded by Meyer to approve the bid from D&T Services for demolition and removal of refuse in the amount of \$1,922. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

The **September 2022 Claims** were reviewed by the board. The claims included the aforementioned bid from D&T Services. After discussion, the **claims** were unanimously approved on a motion from Seuferer, seconded by Mefferd.

Unfinished Business:

Doors Inc. Replacement of South (Front) Entrance Door and Surround:

Meyer updated the board on the progress of the front door replacement project. The design is working its way through design approval by the Chariton Historical Preservation Commission, who voiced some concerns on the final color of the doors and soffits. Meyer will continue discussions with the CHPC and the board will contact Bruce Smith of Smith Auto Body for options to paint the doors before installation.

PRIMO HVAC Concerns: Librarian Murphy shared with the board that PRIMO technicians visited the library on September 8th and met with herself and board members Bisgard and Meyer to address ongoing concerns about the HVAC system. Three of the four units installed are currently working. One unit has a cracked drip pan, which may be causing the unit to shut down. PRIMO indicated they would continue to work with Murphy and the library board to resolve the issues.

New Business:

Consideration to approve Bovard Studio quote for restoration of stained glass windows: The board discussed a bid from Bovard Studio for restoration of the original stained glass windows on the west and east sides of the original building. The board reviewed material presented by Bovard Studio and discussed the current state of the windows. It was moved by Mefferd and seconded by Bisgard that because the project is of a specialized nature such that there are likely no other credible bidders available, and on the basis of Bovard Studio's reputation as a recommended bidder, to accept the bid for restoration of the stained glass windows for the amount of \$21,483. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Consideration of adding monthly off-site server backup service to contract with Mainstay Systems: Director Murphy recommended that the board approve the addition of a monthly off-site server backup service to the library's existing contract with Mainstay Services. Murphy told the board that the library's servers are currently backed up on three portable hard drives, which is a time-consuming process and could lead to the loss of data. After discussion, it was moved by Bisgard and seconded by Seuferer to approve the addition of the off-site server backup service to the library's contract with Mainstay Systems at the cost of \$864 per year. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Spectrum Lighting Installation and Library Closure: Director Murphy shared that Spectrum Lighting is ready to install lighting fixtures on September 29th and 30th. It was Murphy's recommendation that the library close on those two days to allow for the work to be completed. It was moved by Seuferer and seconded by Mefferd to authorize Murphy to close the library on September 29th and 30th for lighting installation. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

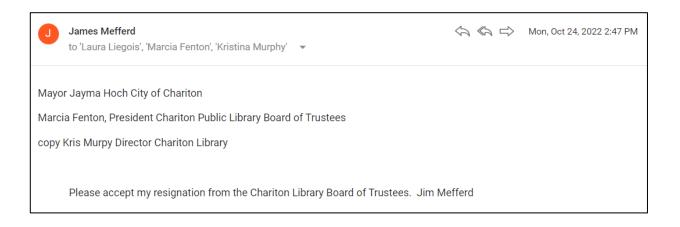
Dear Members of the Public Library Board of Directors,

CHARITON FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S REPORT THURSDAY NOVEMBER 10, 2022

I filed our Annual Report to the State. I'm beginning our local annual report formatted to share with the public and our local funding bodies. You'll have it in December with the budget request.

I created a splash page on our website. Since we began using the Chromeboxes we've been unable to track usage statistics for them. At the same time, we switched our PC management software to one that only protects patron data and the computer itself by wiping all activity at each logout. We no longer implement Time Limit Manager which controlled and tracked patron use of our public computers because the subscription version now available was beyond our budget, which was only set up to cover the one-time initial purchase of the old software. Our best option was to subscribe annually for the security software (Fortres Grand) and let the Time Limit Manager go. For the annual report this year we had to use the old method of multiplying use numbers we had for a 4-month span to account for annual usage and I suspect it was an undercount, since the Chromeboxes were already in use.

A splash page is a single page embedded in our Library website. It is hidden from navigation and sitemap so that it cannot be located via an outside search. That page is loaded into our Chrome admin (which controls all functions of the Chromeboxes) as the only page that opens when the Chromebox is accessed. Only in-house machines that have a direct link to that page set up as the homepage will hit it. Patrons then have the option of proceeding to our website, our catalog, or Google. It still needs tweaked, but I'll be able to take a look at the website statistics for that page to see its activity, thus to count uses of the Chromeboxes. When all is good, we'll load the same thing on the PCs & everything will be counted again without patrons having to check in at the desk before using the machines, something they love. For the splash page I used the wording approved at our 2/10/22 meeting, when we included it as part of the Internet Policy.

I will speak to our tech support and see how we can go about something similar for our Wi-Fi access, although it would be a way of forcing users to agree to the policy only. We already get stats for Wi-Fi access

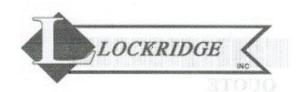

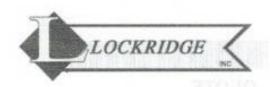

You may note in the numbers for November the first PC/Chromebox usage numbers generated by our new splash page interface. I did estimate the PC usage based on the average of 5 people per day open who usually use that machine to print materials. This is based on staff observation of regular patron behavior. As soon as I can add the splash page to that machine (and any others I can get up and running) we will once again have true numbers to work with. This is a little more complicated than it is with the Chromeboxes due to the other program options available on the PCs.

We had very little program attendance in November, and I'm assuming December will be the same due to the holidays in general and our holiday closures. I had thought that I found a program librarian for us, but scheduling became an issue. We still need to fill this position if we are to deliver successful programming.

I've included a streamlined construction budget in this packet, and look at all that we've accomplished!! This Board should be very proud of all the work that has been completed and the funding secured. Thank you for your time, your attention to details and your actions that made this possible.

Library Accreditation has snuck up on us again. It's due February 28th. We've done really well with keeping up on the policy updates, but there are other things we'll need to cram into January and February to meet our standards.

One of those is trustee training. Your orientation packet included information on Trustee training options, including IA Learns and other online options. To meet the standard each trustee must perform an at least three hours per year of training.

I'm currently working on the ADA checklist for restroom standards as part of our accreditation application. We submitted a full ADA checklist for our last accreditation and are now required to address one of four priorities each accreditation. I chose the restroom priority because there are things we need to address.

I spent some time in December going through our budget history and will prepare a report for you so that when we begin meeting with the City Clerk in February we'll have a good picture of what we need to look at in addition to the investments.

December programming was indeed hit or miss on attendance. We offered 4 programs, but only one got any attendees. 22 people at that one, due to its occurrence on a Friday that was part of the holiday break. We had school-age kids in attendance.

Windows measurements were taken again & it sounds like this project might fall within this fiscal year. On that supposition I've amended the FY24 budget request. We will have to look at amendments to the current budget in February and March to submit a request for amendment prior to April.

We have our first annual staff in-service on Monday, January 16th. In addition to a regular staff meeting, we will view a couple of webinars that address issues relevant to our strategic plan.

Letter of Agreement for Current Participants Enrollment Period: July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024

Important Dates:

- March 31, 2023: Deadline for receipt of signed Letter of Agreement at State Library of Iowa
- Within 90 days receipt of invoice: Deadline for receipt of payment. Library will be invoiced in July.

Member Library Responsibilities:

- The Library agrees to continue its participation in the Bridges Overdrive eAudiobook / eBook
 Consortium for a twelve-month period beginning July 1, 2023 extending through June 30, 2024.
- Signing and returning this Letter of Agreement, along with payment of fees makes the Library
 eligible to continue participation in the Bridges Consortium. Nonpayment will result in suspension
 of patron access.
- The annual Consortium fee for public libraries for downloadable audiobooks and eBooks is
 calculated as follows: a \$300.00 base for each library, plus \$0.21 per capita based on the city
 population in which the library is located. Per capita numbers are based on population figures
 from the 2020 Census certified by the lowa Secretary of State's office. FY24 fees are now
 available at https://www.statelibraryofiowa.gov/index.php/libraries/services-resources/online-resources-libraries/bridges/bridgesfees.
- A library may pay an amount in addition to their annual fee as an extraordinary contribution to the
 development of the collection. A Library that pays an amount in excess of that Library's annual fee
 will have the option of selecting additional content of their own choice up to the amount of the
 extra fee they have contributed. Any content so purchased will be the property of the Consortium
 as a whole and will be accessible by all Consortium members. An extraordinary contribution may
 be made at any time during the fiscal year.
- A library agrees to adhere to access, circulation, and collection policies determined jointly by the Bridges Consortium and by eligible group participants.
- The Library agrees to make this service available only to residents of its own city, rural residents
 of its own county, and/or residents of contracting cities. Open Access customers are not eligible
 for this service. The Library agrees to cooperate with the Bridges Consortium in a good faith
 effort toward this goal.
- With the above goal in mind, the Library is asked to make reasonable distinctions between eligible
 and ineligible patrons (ineligible meaning Open Access or out of state patrons) and agrees to work
 with the Bridges Management Team in this effort.
- The Library agrees to provide first-level technical support to their patrons, understanding that
 State Library of lowa acts as back-up support for the Library. In providing first-level technical
 support, the Library agrees that it will not publish or distribute contact names, emails, or phone
 numbers of State Library of lowa staff to local patrons.
- The Library understands that if the Library withdraws, the content remains the property of the Bridges Consortium.

State Library of Iowa Responsibilities:

- State Library of lowa will manage the Consortium in partnership with Overdrive on behalf of the participants of the Consortium.
- State Library of Iowa will act as the fiscal agent for the Consortium.
- State Library of lowa will continue to provide authentication services to member Libraries who
 choose not to authenticate through their own ILS system.
- State Library of lowa will work with selectors comprised of member libraries to ensure a quality collection.

Iowa Code 256.69 Local Financial Support

Commencing July 1, 1977, each city within its corporate boundaries and each county within the unincorporated area of the county shall levy a tax of at least six and three-fourths cents per thousand dollars of assessed value on the taxable property or at least the monetary equivalent thereof when all or a portion of the funds are obtained from a source other than taxation, for the purpose of providing financial support to the public library which provides library services within the respective jurisdictions. 1993 Acts, ch 48, §32Referred to in 256.51, 336.13, 692A.101

In other words, a tax of at least \$.0675 per \$1,000 assessed property valuation must be levied by each county and city to provide financial support to the public library which provides them with library service. The tax of at least \$0.0675 per \$1,000 of assessed property required by the Code is an outdated and inadequate minimum. No public library in lowa could keep its doors open if it were funded at this level. Most cities fund their libraries far above the minimum required by the Code.

Public libraries are also funded from the county's rural services fund which includes *road clearing, weed eradication* and sanitary disposal. The maximum levy for rural services is \$3.95 per \$1,000 of assessed value in the unincorporated areas.

The library legally must also receive funding from nearby cities that do not have their own municipal library. To meet the requirements of **lowa Code 256.69**, such cities are required to contract with an established library to obtain service for their residents.

Also, this is payment for services received, NOT A DONATION.

In Service to Iowa: Public Library Standards is the manual for the State Library Standards and Accreditation Program for public libraries. It determines the formula for State funding, and meets statutory requirements. Libraries applying for Tier 3 (accredited) status must meet all 29 (Tier 1), all 12 (Tier 2), and all 6 (Tier 3) standards. They must also meet 20 of 38 optional standards. Below is Standard 10.

10. NO The library receives permanent and equitable funding for services to rural residents from the county (if not the establishing jurisdiction). This standard does not apply to city libraries in counties where there is a county library. Use the following guidelines to help determine equitable funding: To meet this standard, the library's county must support libraries at the rates listed below. Minimum, enhanced, or outstanding rates can be used.

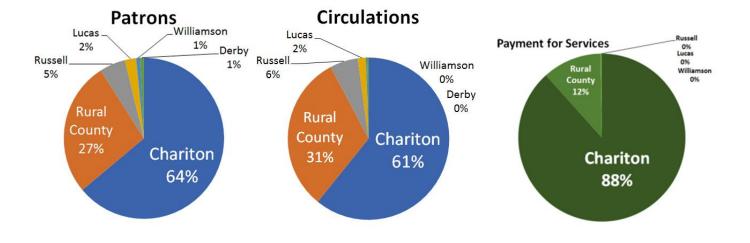

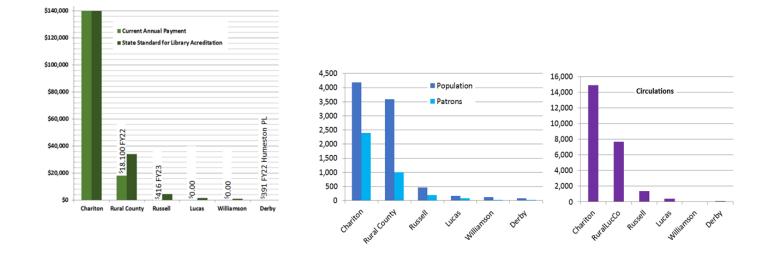

We are looking at two different numbers here. The State law of 1977 requires funding at \$0.0675. The standard set by the State requires \$0.10. Lucas County meets the requirement of a law unchanged since 1977, regardless of all other financial fluctuations in the following years. In order to meet the state requirement, they'd have to almost double their annual payment for services.

Let's take a look at other factors.





Use of the Library can currently only be determined by Patron Cardholder and Circulation data. These graphs demonstrate the great inequality of funding when compared to Patron use.

Chariton residents provide 88% of the funding for Library services for our entire county.

Rural and small town residents provide only 12% of the funding. But they account for almost 40% of the use of those services.

Is it any wonder we struggle to provide services for all of our residents, cannot afford to offer wages to fully staff the Library, and struggle to maintain our network technology and Library facility?

The only way to remedy this is for all residents to pay their fair share.

Building & Grounds

Feb. 3, 2023

Justin Sharp and Denny Bisgard discussed several items over the last month, touching base with Kris when needed. The top items receiving attention have been the elevator contract and maintenance requirement for it, plus the electrical project of cleaning up the "confusing" low voltage lighting that has been in place for many years.

Justin has had several conversations with the elevator companies to understand what we have. He will have a recommendation for the Board meeting on Feb. 9.

Denny, Kris, and Ray have meet with Rusty Stansbery to talk through the changes to be made. Kris had a wonderful diagram to give us the basics of what switch and low voltage relay controlled which set of lights. Some circuits are currently not working and some lights can't be turned off. There are 2 timers also that are not working.

Rusty's proposal is to start with the 12 switches located by the copy machine. It will take some downtime, so Kris has recommended he do this on a Sunday. Rusty is good with that. Phase 2 involves, pulling the old wires out and running new wires from the breaker box downstairs. There will be some work in that breaker box, but the same conduit is planning to be used. We might even be able to use the same switches. Work will be done by accessing a junction box above the suspended ceiling in the Genealogy room. By using the existing conduit, all walls should be undisturbed and the switches will remain where they are. He will have a helper to pull wires, but should complete this phase on the same day. Rusty's estimate for Phase 2 is \$500-750. He is ready to start when we give the go ahead.

The next phase has some longer runs with 12 switches also involved. The timers involved are part of this phase. By dividing this into 2 phases, the risk is more manageable. The knowledge gained on Phase 1 should help Phase 2.

A list of projects is being revamped from the prior committee work. Priorities and the method of funding will need to be clearly defined with help from the rest of the Board.

Question: How can we make the Library a positive influence in the community?

- Murphy will ask Assistant Director Ghormley to create and place content in the newspaper and on Facebook to promote Interlibrary Loan options and to explain how item requests work. The promo will highlight how the Library purchases or borrows items when someone requests something we don't own, in the hopes that those who are unaware of these options will know that it is a good way to suggest items for the collection, and even if we can't purchase it, we'll borrow it for them via interlibrary loan.
- Murphy and Ghormley will create content on the variety of ways to place a memorial item in the Library.
 Murphy will review the process with Staff and Ghormley will place the content in the newspaper and on Facebook.

We did a quick review of the Library Strategic Plan and the two goals outlined in it that should be addressed by this committee.

Goal: Engage with community members and stakeholders to better understand and support their needs, and increase the visibility and impact of Library spaces, services, collections, and partnerships, and illustrate the Library's role in a thriving community.

Goal: Revitalize Friends of the Library

- Prepare a Friends mailer, including a brief survey, and mail it out to our Fundraising and Friends mailing lists by 8/2023.
- Offer a Friends of the Library Open House during Friends of the Library Week in October. The mailer can include an invitation to the event, but it will also be open to the public and promoted.
- Miller will communicate with Centerville's Drake Public Library about their Friends group to get ideas on what our potential group could do in support of our Library.
- Murphy will email content to the committee, including ALA's United for Libraries Friends Toolkit and suggestions for content and training available online.
- Murphy will ask Friends treasurer C. Wright to bring in the Friends fund documents. If there is enough still in the account, we'll use it to cover the mailing.

Finance/Policy Committee Meeting February 6, 2023 2:00 (City Council Chambers, City Hall)

Attended: Meyer, Seuferer, Metzger, Murphy, Liegois. Absent: Fenton

There was discussion of the various reports received from City Clerk Metzger. We find the current Treasurer's Report redundant and suggested that Metzger not bother with it anymore. We will instead use the same report that the City Council gets at their second monthly meeting, which is generated by the finance system.

At this time, since all of our bequests have been transferred to the operating fund, either for building project expenses or to be reinvested in CDs (principal-restricted bequests, Allender, Blake, Dewey & Herrick), we're going to start fresh with the 167 Library Endowment budget line. In future only the bequests named above will be tracked on that budget line. Any additional restricted bequests will be added to that budget line and the unrestricted "special project" funds will continue to show up in the Library operating fund.

We discussed the option of separating out current and future funds which are to be used for projects, like the current revitalization project. Metzger and Liegois thought that in the budget for FY25 it might be possible to create a separate budget line that would allow us to track such "capital" income and expenditures. It is unlikely that we'd be able to do this with the FY24 budget since its numbers have already been determined.

In the meantime, Murphy will attempt to provide the information we need to see by adding a "Capital Projects" column to accompany the monthly financial report generated from the City's financial system. It will allow us to see the difference between the fiscal year operating budget and the special projects that are currently being funded in part by the bequest funds also showing in our ongoing operating fund.

The committee reviewed the CD proposals provided by Metzger for the investment of the restricted bequests. The committee recommends going with Community 1st Credit Union. (see proposals in current Board Packet)

The Finance/Policy Committee plans to meet regularly, possibly monthly, in future.

Our budget presentation to the City Council on January 26th went very well. I distributed our FY22 Annual Report pamphlet, a construction project budget, a copy of our new Strategic Plan, and a handout on funding inequities. Marcia & I spoke about the efforts of the Fundraising Committee and the funds raised, the building projects, and our inability to find a program coordinator. I also asked the Council to take a look at the funding inequities and possibly assist us in pushing for larger payments for library services from our County and the cities of Russell, Williamson and Lucas. This handout is included in our meeting materials for today.

I've added Continuing Education to our agenda, to make it easier for us to track who's taken a course and when. We'll include it in the monthly minutes. This will also act as a reminder to us all to get our credits done before our next accreditation comes around. And if it's in the minutes, even when there's a change in board membership, the information will be easy to access when the time comes.

After participating in a State Library trustee training on policies, Marcia brought Susan and I together with Mayor Jayma Hoch in her capacity as Clinical/Disaster Services Manager for LCHC. She is also on the Lucas County Emergency Planning Committee. The four of us took a look through an unfinished disaster plan for the Library that was begun in 2020 and various security and emergency procedures materials I've created for the staff.

Jayma asked all the right questions and had many answers we needed. She gave us suggestions on steps we need to take and the names and titles of local individuals who can assist us with issues and training.

When Denny came in to meet with the electrician about light switch issues, he noticed that one of the outside units was completely frosted up. I contacted Alex at Primo & he came the following day. He thought there might be a leak, so added more Freon and set the unit to defrost. The following day the thermostat again said "auxiliary" heat. He's keeping an eye on it.

We got a package delivered with a "sorry" slip from the post office. It also contained a small remainder of the original packaging and 3 of the 4 books that should have been in the shipment. One of those was damaged. The other 2, \$44.18 worth of memorials was gone. The post office told me there was nothing they could do about it. I'm contacting Baker & Taylor to see if the shipment was insured.

It is an excellent representative of Carnegie libraries, especially those in Iowa, and an excellent example of how such a library can be expanded without losing its original character. For many, our building epitomizes the character of traditional libraries. The modern contents of the shelves and the technology available cannot diminish that feeling. It's this sense of living history that we want to maintain, especially as an example to future generations, of the successful marriage between history and the present.

We are in the midst of a multiyear facility revitalization project. We now anticipate the entire project will take four years. In 2020 we began working with an architectural team to assess facility issues and draw up plans to address those issues.

In 2021 we completed a \$51,964 roof project, restructuring the flat portion of our roof to facilitate drainage, and installed new gutters and drainpipes. A smaller but similar project was completed on the canopy over the north entrance for \$767.

In 2022 we replaced several dated HVAC units and installed a "whole house" dehumidifier system to address dampness in the basement at an expense of \$45,500. We spent another \$166,847 excavating, regrading and waterproofing around all three walls of the original 1904 structure, and installing sump pumps to eliminate leaks. Once that was completed, we paid a local company \$1,922 to remove damaged surfaces and furniture in the basement. Currently, we're waiting at least a year for the basement to dry sufficiently so that we can begin reclaiming the space we so desperately need.

In 2022 we also revamped our suspended light fixtures with LED units for \$9,275, which should reduce our electric bill and lights the Library up like never before!

Two generous donors gave us \$10,000 to purchase the land west of the building, which we now hope to turn into a garden and activity area. We'll install device charging stations (purchased for \$6,037) and seating areas to expand Library services beyond our weekly hours and building.

Up next is the replacement of our main entrance door and surround, and the replacement of all of the casement windows throughout the building. We've secured \$57,700 in funding for those projects.

And that brings us to the stained glass window project, which we're asking The Lucas County Community Foundation to help us accomplish this year. I've attached our contract with Bovard Studio which includes all of the specifics for this project.

We implemented a fundraising drive which so far has generated almost \$30,000. We transferred all of our "spendable" bequest funds to our operating fund and have spent \$244,800 of them so far. We have applied for and received several grants, including the \$10,000 the South Central Community Foundation granted us in 2021.

We are very grateful for the support our local community foundation has shown the Library so often in the past, and we hope you'll consider granting \$22,557 for our stained glass project.

There is a maximum fine of \$5.00 per item once the item is returned.

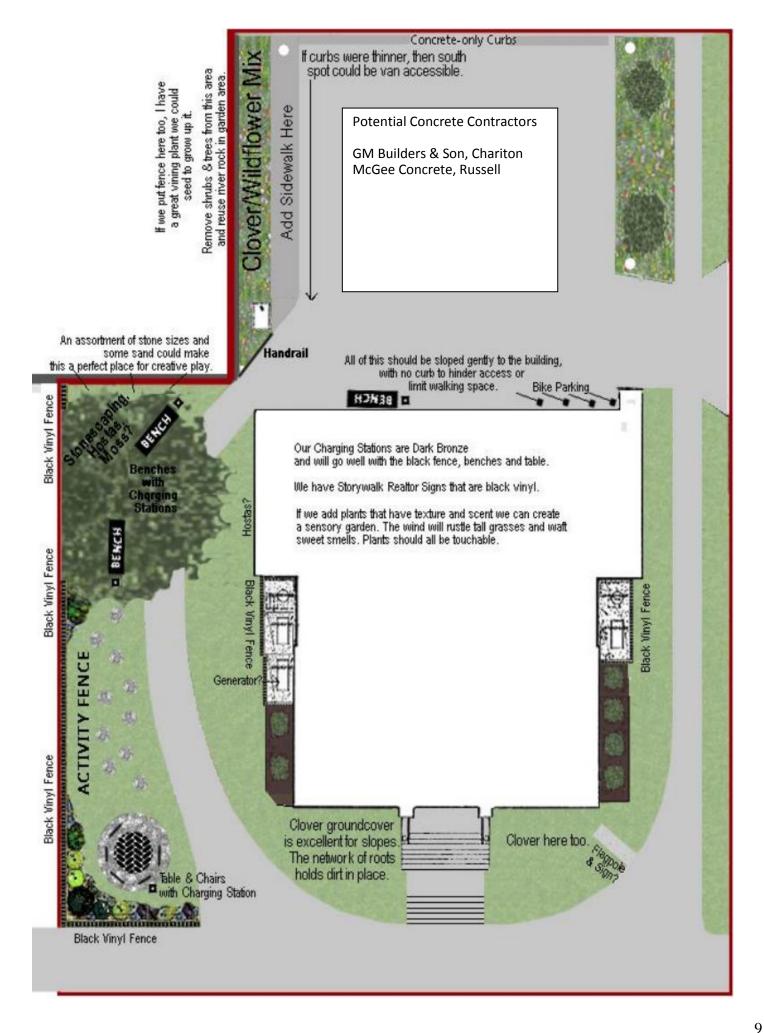

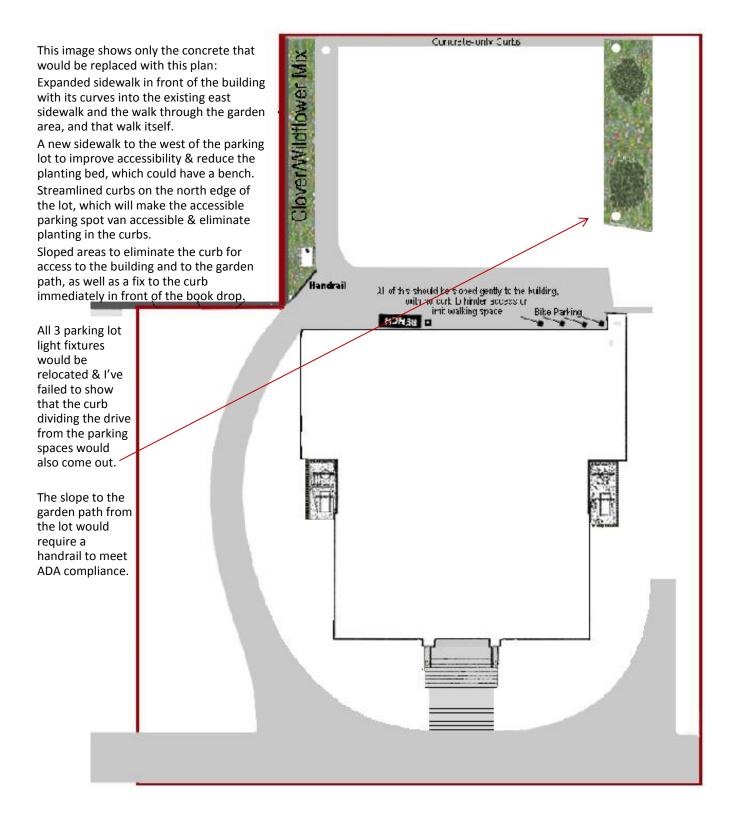
2022-P <u>Public Improvements</u> – The City did not publish a notice of the public hearing for a street project and a library project as required by Chapters 26.12 and 362.3 of the Code of Iowa. In addition, for these same projects, the City did not obtain competitive bids as required by Chapters 26.3 and 314.1B of the Code of Iowa. An engineer was not used for the projects in question, as required by Chapter 26.3 of the Code of Iowa. In addition, no bid security was provided to the City for these projects, as required by Chapter 26.8 of the Code of Iowa.

<u>Recommendation</u> – The City should implement procedures for public improvement projects to ensure compliance with Chapters 26, 362.3 and 314.1B of the Code of Iowa in relation to public hearings, competitive bids, use of an engineer and bid security.

In the Auditor's final report for FY22 the Library was cited for failure to publish notice of a public hearing concerning our drainage remediation/waterproofing project. (see page 8 of this packet)

At the Staff In-Service on February 20th we discussed several topics. We began that morning with a recorded webinar of the ILOC Keynote speech by R. David Lankes. If you haven't watched this one yet, please do. He does an excellent job of outlining the evolution of libraries in society, highlighting the different roles the Library plays as society and technology evolve. His speech is one of the most positive and motivating that I've ever heard, and the staff agreed. It set us up for a great day.

We moved on to the Library's strategic plan and spoke specifically about the goal to provide "at home" delivery. Ghormley, Brown and I had previously discussed our desire to provide this service, and afterwards I researched several documents and procedures of other Iowa libraries and drafted an agreement form, request form and policy, as well as a letter we will send out to group residential facilities and other partners. We will meet again to tweak these documents prior to submitting them to the Board for approval.

We then discussed the community engagement/focus groups goal and generated a list of individuals and entities that might be asked to participate. The goal is to make the focus groups as diverse as possible, including as many non-library users as library users.

Our third topic of the day was the summer program. We went through some options for participation logs and rewards and decided to purchase a button machine so that participants could have a hand in creating their own rewards. The theme this year is *Find Your Voice* and we believe this type of reward integrates perfectly. We also look forward to using the machine for years to come.

In an effort to involve more teens and adults in the program this summer we'd like to offer a recurring workshop involving "smash books," which are something of a conglomeration of journal, scrapbook, commonplace book and sketchbook. Much of the process of creating these items can be broken down into weekly activities and the nature of the project is very nonthreatening to any who believe they have no artistic talent. I've directed each staff member to take some time and some of the wealth of raw material we have on hand to start an example that highlights the summer theme.

One set of light switches has been upgraded. The stained glass windows have gone to be repaired.

ENRICH IOWA AGREEMENT PUBLIC LIBRARY

FY24 (JULY 1, 2023 - JUNE 30, 2024)



The Enrich lowa program includes Direct State Aid for public libraries, Open Access for public and academic libraries, and Interlibrary Loan Reimbursement. The library will participate according to the Terms of Agreement for each program.

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- A. Libraries must return this completed Enrich Iowa Agreement indicating the programs the library will participate in. This form must be signed by the library director or other signatory authority. This completed form must be received by the State Library, Des Moines office, by April 30, 2023.
- B. A public library must participate in Open Access and Interlibrary Loan Reimbursement in order to be eligible for Direct State Aid funding.
- C. A public library must meet Direct State Aid Tier 1 requirements or higher in order to receive Open Access or Direct State Aid funding.
- A library may choose to participate in Interlibrary Loan Reimbursement without participating in Direct State Aid or Open Access.

2. ASSURANCES

- A. Our public library named below was established on or before July 1, 2021, in accord with the Code of lowa.
- B. Our public library meets Tier 1 requirements or higher. This is required for Open Access and Direct State Aid funding.
- C. Our public library has submitted to the State Library a copy of the most recent ordinance or other legal documentation establishing our library as a public library.
- Our library will meet FY24 program reporting requirements.
- E. Our library will use all Enrich lowa funds to improve library services.
- F. Our library's Enrich lowa funds will supplement, not supplant, any other funding received by the library. Our library will inform the city and/or county of this requirement and we will report noncompliance to the State Library. We understand that if the funding is used to replace local funds, the funds received must be returned and our library will not be eligible for Enrich lowa funding the following year.

Our library will provide information for auditing purposes, if requested by the State Library.

CHARITON PUBLIC LIBRARY CIRCULATION POLICY

(Approved 1/13/2022) (REVISED DRAFT 4/13/2023)

Patron Eligibility and Responsibilities

The Library has no residency requirements to apply for a Library card. Applicants need only provide proof of their actual physical residence and a mailing address, if different from the residential address.

Persons under the age of 16 must have a parent or guardian sign their registration.

Library privileges may be suspended or revoked if overdue items are not returned, fines or damage or replacement costs are not paid, or if the patron violates any part of the Library Conduct Policy.

Some electronic services, such as BRIDGES downloadable e-content and Online Databases are provided by vendors who enforce restrictions within their contract, allowing only residents of the Library's legal service area to access their content. The Library's legal service area is determined by tax funding and includes residents of the Cities of Chariton, Derby, Lucas, Russell and Williamson, and the residents of the rural areas of Lucas County. The Library will abide by its contract with such vendors, and cardholders who live outside of the legal service area will not have access to these services.

Patrons are responsible for all transactions committed with their card. It is strongly recommended that a patron not lend his/her card to others as the patron will be held responsible for any fines or fees accrued on the card. The Parent or Guardian is responsible for all transactions committed by a minor, or with that minor's card. Patrons shall give immediate notice of a lost Library card.

Patrons must present their library card or a picture ID to conduct any transaction. Patrons are responsible for returning borrowed materials or equipment to the Library, clean and in good condition, on or before the date due.

Patrons shall report any damage to materials or equipment to the Library staff. Patrons are responsible for prompt payment of fines for everdue items, damage costs for materials or equipment, and assessments for lost items.

Registration for Library Card

Library cards are issued for three years, and are renewable upon expiration. Cardholders must notify the Library if their name, address extelephone number or email address changes from that listed in their record. Temporary cards may be issued for a year. Temporary Cardholders are asked to notify the Librarian when they leave the community.

Applications: Patrons must apply for a Library card in person and present a picture identification—and verification of address. A driver's license and a piece of recently received mail are preferred. Acceptable forms of identification and proof of address are a State ID, Driver's License, Student ID, or Passport.

Registration includes full name, birthdate, home address, telephone number and email address. PO Box addresses may be added to the account for mailing purposes, but a patron's home address must be provided to demonstrate actual location of taxpayer residence. Patrons shall read the Patron Responsibility and Waiver of Confidentiality Agreement when registering for a Library card. Signing the patron registration indicates compliance with the conditions of this Agreement.

Lost Card

A patron who reports a lost card may re-register at the circulation desk. Picture identification is required. There is a \$1 fee for the first replacement card, a \$5 fee for the second, and a \$10 fee for each subsequent replacement card. A permanent record of each replacement will be placed in the patron's account. Once a card number is replaced, the original number can no longer be used in the Library's system & if the card is located, it should be destroyed.

Patron Responsibility

 - 13. The records of a library which, by themselves or when examined with other public records, would reveal the identity of the library patron checking out or requesting an item or information from the library. The records shall be released to a criminal or juvenile justice agency only pursuant to an investigation of a particular person or organization suspected of committing a known crime. The records shall be released only upon a judicial determination that a rational connection exists between the requested release of information and a legitimate end and that the need for the information is cogent and compelling.

Borrowing Limits & Loan Periods

Patrons may check out unlimited Books for a three-week two-week period, with an option to renew once.

Patrons may check out unlimited Audiobooks per card for a three-week two-week period, with an option to renew once.

Patrons may check out five (5) Videos per card for seven (7) days. Videos are non-renewable.

Renewals

Borrowed items may be renewed in person, by telephone, or online for one additional loan period, with the exception of Videos or other one-week items.

The Librarian has discretion to make exceptions to renewal on high demand items or items on reserve.

Extended loans cannot be renewed.

Items which have holds pending cannot be renewed.

Items eligible for renewal will be renewed automatically.

Extensions & Educational Loans

Items may be checked out, upon request, for a 6-week 4-week period to accommodate vacations, illness or other patron needs. The extended checkout time will include the one available renewal.

Items borrowed for use in an educational setting; a classroom, daycare or home-schooling situation, may be checked out for an extended period to meet the needs of a given project. A teacher or other education professional may request an extension at the time of checkout. A student must present documentation in the form of a course syllabus or assignment sheet. Extensions are at the discretion of the Librarian, and may not be granted on high-demand materials. The individual borrowing the items is responsible for their return and any late fees which accrue.

Holds

Patrons may place holds on items through the Librarian at the circulation desk. A hold can only be placed on an item which is currently checked-out or otherwise unavailable. "Pending" holds remain in the system for 60 days. Once a "pending" hold becomes "ready", patrons will be notified by phone and will have 5 business days following the day of notification to pick up the item before it passes on to the next patron or is returned to the shelf.

Interlibrary Loans

The Chariton Public Library participates in Interlibrary Loan Programs sponsored by the State Library of Iowa. The Library will request materials for patrons from other Iowa libraries if the material is not in our collection. Patrons must have a current library card and no outstanding fines or assessments to be eligible for this service. Materials copyrighted in the past year are generally not available through this service. A one-month lending period shall apply unless the lending library states otherwise. The Chariton Public Library will lend its materials to other libraries when such a request is received.

In addition, as part of the statewide Open Access program, Chariton Public Library patrons may acquire borrower cards at other lowa Libraries and check out materials at those Libraries. Those materials can then be returned to the Chariton Public Library and will be returned to the lending Library at no cost to the patron.

Audio-Visual Equipment Loans

Patrons must be 16 years old and have a current library card to borrow Library equipment. At the time the equipment is borrowed, the patron shall sign a contract claiming all responsibility for the equipment until it is returned. Equipment must be returned, in person, to the Librarian, by the patron who signed the contract. All issues and damages are to be reported to the Librarian, who will set a damage or replacement fee, if applicable. A variety of projectors and screens are available for checkout. Patrons may consult the Librarian for specifics. All equipment loans are at the discretion of the Librarian.

Fees Fines

Overdue fines will be assessed to patrons for items that are returned after the due date.

Books and Audiobooks are fined 10⁴ per item per day

Movies are fined 50⁴ per item per day

Per day fines will not apply to Sundays, holidays or days that the Library is not open.

Library Patrons with overdue items unpaid fines of \$2.50 or more shall have borrowing privileges suspended until all items on the card are returned. fines are paid.

There is a maximum fine of \$5.00 per item ence the item is returned.

Items more than two months overdue will be considered lost or stolen.

Damaged, Lost or Stolen Items

Patrons are responsible for returning borrowed materials in good condition and may be assessed costs for damaged or lost items. Unreturned items more than two months overdue will be considered lost or stolen and replacement costs will be assessed. (lowa Codes 702.22, 808.12, and 714.5)

Library privileges may will be suspended or revoked if damage or replacement assessments are not paid. Legal action may be taken by the Library upon failure to return items or pay the costs assessed.

Assessments will include the actual replacement and processing costs. "Avoidable damage" to the cases housing audiovisual items, such as the heat-warping that occurs when the item is left in the sun or near a heat source, will also be assessed to the patron in addition to payment for any damage sustained by the parts inside the case.

Amounts are assessed per item and determined by the Library Director, using current availability and pricing as listed by product providers, with replacement costs for individual parts of audiovisual items determined by the source of purchase or replacement.

All payments made to the Library are non-refundable.

Claim of Return

Patrons may make a Claim of Return if they believe that an item still checked-out on their card has been returned. Staff will check to ascertain if the item has actually been misplaced within the Library, while the item itself remains checked-out on the patron's card. If the item is located in the Library, it will be removed from the patron's record with no fees assessed.

If the item is not found in the Library after two months, the item will be converted to a "lost item" in the Library's system, pending further action. Patrons must return the item if they locate it, or pay the replacement price to have it officially removed from their record.

At the Staff In-Service on April 7th we discussed several topics. We began with our meeting topics list, an ongoing document where concerns are listed to be discussed at the upcoming meeting. We discussed issues associated with Bin/Kit circulations and are going to remove individual titles from the catalog of items located in the bins. They will only circulate as part of the Bin/Kit.

We moved on to the Circulation Policy and input gathered from other Iowa libraries. There was a lot of discussion. Only one staff member still believes discontinuation of fines is a bad idea. We are set to go ahead with the change.

We then discussed our proposed Library-to-Go delivery program. This still needs much work before we can bring it to the Board. We revisited a handout created for patrons about a year ago that teaches them how to select and request their own interlibrary loans. We will begin offering it to patrons whenever they request an interlibrary loan. So far 4 patrons regularly use this option. Ghormley will feature this option in her next press release.

I will take my vacation in May and staff have agreed to coordinate guest readers for May StoryTimes. I presented the flyer and reading/activity log for the summer program, which I began early this year due to the vacation. We have 4 performer programs (\$1,600) scheduled for kids, a sing-a-long we're hoping a local will perform for us, and one kid-oriented craft program. The finale will likely involve the creation of t-shirts and will also feature our new button machine.

In an effort to involve more teens and adults in program activities this summer we've asked Dale O'Connell to teach a two-hour alcohol ink class (\$500) limited to 20 attendees. Assistant Director Lauri Ghormley will offer a mandala painting class, limited to 30 attendees. Chris Brown will offer a nail art program for adults, teens and kids.

One of our big hopes for attendance and participation this summer will be the Smash Book program, scheduled Wednesdays June 7-July 19. It is for teens and adults.

The other set of light switches have been upgraded. Rusty fixed the NW lot fixture and installed a digital timer, but we're still having issues with it. He'll keep trying.

The front door is in. All we need to do to complete that project is sand and paint the trim and do some patching and repainting of the wall inside.

Isaac's team came to do the grading/seeding on 4/11/23.

No word yet on the window replacements or the stained glass.

Our next big issue is the soffits, eaves and other trim. Some of you may have noticed the rubber membrane from the gutters is loose and hanging down and the gutters are leaking worse than ever. Window frames will have to be addressed after the windows are replaced. Tuckpointing and parging are also necessary. Parging is similar to stucco. I wonder if we could find a local contractor to do it?

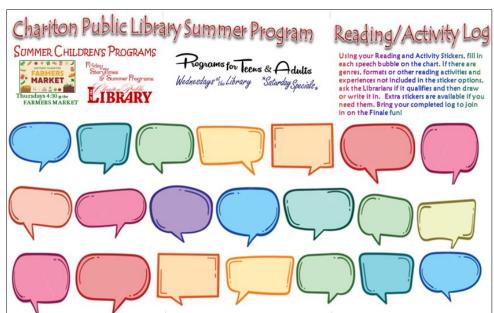

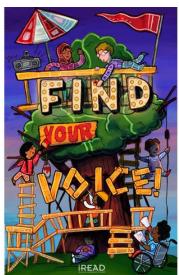

The Lucas County Community Foundation granted us \$11,000 for the stained glass window projects. That funding was deposited on May 5th.

We received another donation from Gregory Burley Brown with instructions to use it as we choose.

We've also received several donations in memory of former Library employee Donna Sallee. The family said to use them as we choose. Steve is still bringing in donations periodically, so we don't have a total yet.

Denny resolved the timer issue for the parking lot and north entrance lights.

Lauri placed the white vinyl signage on both the front and back doors.

The grass is growing, although some areas look more successful than others. The water bill might be scary.

Andy has installed 17 of the new windows. They are double-hung sash windows and we can tilt them in to clean the outsides! The UV filtered glass is wonderful! The only windows we'll likely need blinds for are those in the meeting room to allow better viewing of the projector image. None of the windows were salvageable. Some were in much worse shape than we realized, with rotting frames. Andy will finish installing windows when the new grass and his schedule permit.

Our electric bill should look a bit better. We've reached the point in the year at which the system is often turned off whenever the weather permits.

On 5/1/23 a patron tripped and fell on the curb at the north entrance. Sue Terrell of LCGS was immediately on the spot to ensure the patron was blanketed and her head held stable while we waited on an ambulance. The incident was reported to Ghormley at the circulation desk, who went to assist. An incident report was completed.

I was on vacation May 12th -29th and ill through June 5th.

No deposit was made in May due to my illness. We did however receive our second tax dollar allocation from the City, \$70,000.

Staff held a special meeting on June 3rd to review and discuss the Summer Program beginning this week.

The Summer Program registrations are coming in. Patrons who wish to attend the Teen/Adult Saturday programs will register for these limited attendance events through the events calendar on our website.

I hope to see an immense growth in our programming numbers for June and July.

Staff did a great deal of summer program decorating in May. Our display case will be used to showcase crafts and other program items both prior to events and afterwards, when patrons will be given the opportunity to show off their work.

The Smash Book project has taken over the meeting room. We hope to have a good turnout, but patrons don't have to register specifically for this program, so we have no idea what we'll get.

We will offer smaller LEGO opportunities at the upstairs activity table frequently throughout the summer program, but kids won't be allowed to save their creations from one week to the next.

Steve Sallee came in with two totes of Donna's books. They are in great shape, of course, so some will likely go on the shelves.

I weeded several deceased patrons from the system this month.

As Denny noted, all of the windows have been replaced.

I received a report from Bovard that they have begun releading our stained glass. The original material was zinc, but to use zinc again would push the cost up, so they are using lead instead.

I will make my report to the Vredenburg Foundation this month and apply for this year's grant as well.

We filed all the paperwork to receive the AARP grant. I signed a letter of understanding as to the use of the funds and we submitted a W9 form with assistance from City Clerk Christy Metzger.
